

The Gandhi Model United Nations Internal Conference was hosted at GMIS Jakarta on the 15th and 16th of February 2023. Under the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization council, the meeting discussed a matter of great importance: "Combatting Illicit Trafficking of Cultural Property." 





















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
